NO PLACE FOR HIS HEAD

Is it possible to fathom the depth of sacrifice the second person of the Godhead made in becoming flesh for us? The apostle Paul reminded the Christians at Corinth of the grace of the Lord Jesus, saying, "though He was rich, yet for your sake He became poor, that you through His poverty might become rich" (2 Cor. 8:9). The riches of Christ pre-existed His incarnation. He did not come as an earthly king. He was among us as a servant. While on earth, Scripture testifies that He had no place to lay His head (Mt. 8:20). As our example of selflessness, Jesus "existed in the form of God, [and] did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant..." (Ph. 2:6-7). Think of the majesty and splendor Christ surrendered on our behalf!

But, to what depths was our Lord willing to sink? We are told that "He came to His own, and those who were His own did not receive Him" (Jn. 1:11). Just as the prophet predicted centuries earlier, Jesus was "despised and forsaken of men" (Is. 53:5). He did not come to be showered by the riches and accolades of man. He enjoyed much more in the presence of the Father before He emptied Himself and became flesh. He became poor (poverty-stricken) that we might become rich. His was not the poverty of a slack hand—but the poverty of self-sacrifice. As an act of voluntary self-sacrifice, He took the form of a servant to meet the deepest and most urgent needs of humanity. Without any self-imposed limits, Jesus went all the way and "humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross" (Ph. 2:8).

Because of Jesus' willingness to become poor, we possess great riches—all spiritual blessings in Christ (Eph. 1:3). Included in this is the promise of an eternal inheritance. Heaven is glorious beyond description. Its riches transcend our wildest imagination. Therefore, "the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us" (Rm. 8:18). In fact, we are told that this "momentary, light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory far beyond all comparison" (2 Cor. 4:17).

God's children ought never to speak about being poor. James says, "Let the brother of humble circumstances glory in his high position" (Jas. 2:9). Jesus became poor for us. He surrendered a place to rest His head so that we might rest our burden upon Him and find everlasting peace in the sheltering arms of His love.
