QUESTIONING CHRISTIANITY

A questioning mind is not a spiritual detriment, but a fountain to spiritual growth. Questions are important to Christians for at least two reasons: (1) they enhance learning; and, (2) they build faith. God has answered every spiritual need we have through Jesus (2 Pet. 1:3).

There are many questions asked and answered in the gospel of Luke. Perhaps, this is because Luke is a non-Jewish writer addressing his gospel to the Greeks. The Greek culture enjoyed asking questions to stimulate thinking among the people. Most of us have heard of Socrates, Plato, and other ancient Greek philosophers who had a tremendous impact on the intellectual climate of the pagan world of the first century. Robert Nichols observed that "During several centuries preceding the Christian era the Greek people had the most vigorous intellectual life in the world. Thought about the great questions over which men have always pondered, about the origin and meaning of the world, about God and man, and right and wrong, flourished among them as nowhere else" (The Growth of the Christian Church, p. 4). Some indication of this may be seen in a parenthetical phrase found in Acts 17:21, where Luke explains, "Now all the Athenians and strangers visiting there use to spend their time in nothing other than telling or hearing something new." These people were thinkers. They didn't have many answers, but they sure had a lot of questions! It seems likely that Theophilius, the man to whom the book of Luke is addressed, was of a similar mind-set. Perhaps, this is why the inspired author went to great lengths to present the life of Christ in an orderly and precise manner.

While questions are important, answers are even more important. Keep in mind that the answers to life's most important questions are not found in our institutions of higher learning. In bringing the message of the cross to the Greeks, Paul said that "the world through its wisdom did not come to know God" (1 Cor. 1:21). The ancient Greek philosophers could find no adequate answers to the most important questions because these questions call for spiritual insight. No matter how bright and intelligent a person may be, right answers cannot be found by looking in the wrong places! Jesus asked some of life's greatest questions in the gospel of Luke. By looking at some of these questions and their corresponding answers, we can find answers to life's most pressing spiritual needs. This is what we plan to do for the next several weeks. We will begin next week by asking: "For what is a man profited if he gains the whole world, and loses or forfeits himself?" (Lk. 9:25).
