"HE IS NEARER TO US THAN WE THINK!"

In his classic work, The Practice of the Presence of God, Brother Lawrence says, "You need not cry very loud; He is nearer to us than we think." The apostle Paul made a similar observation in the city of Athens. In his famous address to the ruling council of the city, he told them about their unknown God-the God who created heaven and earth—the God who does not dwell in temples made with human hands the God who does not need human service—the God who gives life and breath to all things—the God who is in control of human events. Then, he says that they should seek Him, "if perhaps they might grope for Him and find Him, though He is not far from each one of us; for in Him we live and move and exist..." (Acts 17:27-28). Although He is not far from each one of us, many remain afar off—separated from God by their sins (Is. 59:1-2). Close proximity does not always make for an easy journey. Reconciliation with God cost Jesus His precious blood. In showing what a difference Christ makes, Paul writes the Ephesians, saying, "But now in Christ Jesus, you who formerly were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ" (2:13). As our "new and living way" (Hb. 10:20), Jesus provides abundant access to the Father. In fact, He is "the way, and the truth, and the life; [and] no one comes to the Father but through [Him]" (Jn. 14:6).

While "He is not far from each one of us", the journey requires humility and earnest seeking. Paul encouraged the Athenians "to grope for Him and find Him." The idea conveyed by the original term is "to feel or grope for or after, as persons in the dark" (Mounce 1314). The image is intense—feeling after God as if you were in total darkness. But, then, he adds, "He is not far from each one of us." He is nearer to us than we think.

The nearness of God provides hope and motivation. We are not outside the scope of His love and forgiveness so long as we are willing to seek Him. Jesus promised: "Ask, and it shall be given to you: seek, and you shall find: knock, and it shall be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it shall be opened" (Mt. 7:7-8). Asking, seeking, and knocking describes an ongoing process—a lifetime habit associated with everlasting discovery.
