FULL HEARTS AND EMPTY PURSES

An exorbitant lottery jackpot arouses the avarice of millions who get caught up in the "get-rich-quick" mentality so prominent among those who choose to spend their money in this way. At best, it is a distraction that turns our focus in the direction of money as the secret to happiness. At worst, lottery participation is an introduction into the dark world of greed and covetousness. As high-sounding and noble as is the rationale behind a state lottery, the process is flawed from the get-go. We cannot build a noble cause by appealing to the baser instincts of humanity. The end does not justify the means—never has, never will. Consider Paul's condemnation of those who said, "Let us do evil that good may come" (Rom. 3:8 cf. 6:1-2).

True happiness is not found in the pursuit of material possessions. The dollar is not almighty. In His warning against greed, Jesus said, "not even when one has an abundance does his life consist of his possessions" (Lk. 12:15). In fact, "those who want to get rich fall into temptation and a snare and many foolish and harmful desires which plunge men into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all sorts of evil, and some by longing for it have wandered away from the faith, and pierced themselves with many griefs" (1 Tim. 6:9-10). People buy lottery tickets because they want to get rich. Acting on such desire invites ruin and destruction.

Earthly wealth will pass away with everything else in the world (1 Jn. 2:15-17). Our hope must be centered on things above (Col. 3:1-2). Paul told Timothy to "Instruct those who are rich in this present world not to be conceited or to fix their hope on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly supplies us with all things to enjoy. Instruct them to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share, storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of that which is life indeed" (1 Tim. 6:17-19). A person's heart is empty without Christ and "unless the heart is full, even a rich man is poor."
