AS MORNING APPEARS

Seeing the possibility of good even in a bad situation is an admirable trait. There are many proverbs in our language expressing unfeigned optimism. Less familiar than most, is the following: "Just as out of the dark ground comes the blossom, so out of the night, a morning appears."

Where did we get such optimism? While many see things only from the most negative perspective, the ability to look at life with optimism is largely a by-product of the fact that we have been specially created by God. The most hopeless are those who have no vision beyond this life—no faith beyond the grave.

One of the most encouraging thoughts in the Bible is that all things will work out for good in the end. We often quote Romans 8:28 in times of adversity as evidence of this fact. In that passage, Paul says, "We know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose."

Indeed, all things work together for good. Why? Because God is active in the affairs of men. He is the prime mover who works providentially to bring about what is truly in our own best interests. We might question such, not knowing how difficult times can work out for good. But, ultimately, we must trust in the wisdom and power of Almighty God. All things do work together for good. To whom? To those who love God and are called according to His purpose. Those who love the Lord will be pliable to the Master's touch. He will be able to mold us and shape us according to His purpose. It is in a stubborn and rebellious disposition that we have most difficulty in bearing with life's hardships.

Character is often shaped in the crucible of suffering. It is not that God brings such into our lives, but that He uses difficult circumstances to forge a strong and resilient faith. James says, "Consider it all joy, my brethren when you encounter various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance. And let endurance have its perfect result, that you may be perfect and complete lacking in nothing" (Jas. 1:2-4). When we place our trust completely in God, even trials and temptations can produce proven character.

Don't lose sight of the promises of God. Paul writes, "No temptation has over-
