A CROSS FOR ME

As Jesus and His disciples were on their way to Caesarea Philippi, He asked, "Who do people say that I am?" (Mk. 8:27). They provided a wide variety of opinions, including John the Baptist, Elijah, or one of the prophets. When Jesus followed up, asking, "But who do you say that I am?" (vs. 29), Peter confessed his belief in Jesus as the Christ, the Son of the living God. Peter must have been riding high after Jesus praised his confession (Mt. 16:17). But things took a turn when Jesus began talking about His coming crucifixion. Because this did not fit in with his view of the promised Messiah, Peter took Jesus aside and began to rebuke Him (Mk. 8:32). Turning His back on Peter, Jesus said, "Get behind me, Satan!" (vs. 33). Peter's interests were not in line with the interests of God in bringing salvation to the lost. Jesus used the occasion to teach the necessity of the cross, both for the Son of Man and for all who would follow Him. He said, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me" (Mk. 8:34).

What does it mean to take up the cross and follow Jesus? For first-century Jews, the cross was an instrument of death. Capital punishment, by means of crucifixion, was commonly practiced. Josephus tells of hundreds of Jews who were crucified in Galilee during the revolts of Judas and Simon Maccabee. By contrast, when we talk about a cross that we have to bear, we usually have in mind some physical or emotional burden. But, this is not at all what Jesus had in mind as He spoke these words to His disciples. Jesus had been plainly talking to the disciples about his coming death by crucifixion. Peter was horrified at the prospect and began rebuking the Lord. Jesus corrected Peter's misconception in the presence of all, saying that no one can be His disciple if he or she is unwilling to follow Him to the cross. F. F. Bruce writes, "The Gospel of Mark was probably written in the first instance for Christians in Rome who were enduring unforeseen and savage persecution under the Emperor Nero in the aftermath of the great fire of A.D. 64. For some of them this persecution involved literal crucifixion" (Hard Sayings 152).

Jesus has a cross for us each of us—but it is not around the neck. Simply put, the cross we take up is our willingness to suffer for the cause of Christ. Remember the words of Paul, who said, "And indeed, all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will be persecuted" (2 Tim. 3:12).
