GOD'S VIEW OF HIMSELF

How does God look at Himself? What is His self-image? The answer is found in what He says about Himself.

Following the incident with the golden calf and the ensuing earnest intercession on behalf of the people, Moses asked the Lord to show him His glory (Ex. 33:18). While he could not see His face, the Lord told Moses that he could see His back as He passed by in front of Him (Ex. 33:20-23). As the Lord passed by, He proclaimed, "The Lord, the Lord God, compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in lovingkindness and truth; who keeps lovingkindness for thousands, who forgives iniquity, transgression and sin; yet He will by no means leave the guilty unpunished, visiting the iniquity of fathers on the children and on the grandchildren to the third and fourth generations" (Ex. 34:6-7). What a marvelous insight into the nature of God! From that time forward, God's servants have appealed to this self-portrait of God in making their requests before His throne.

Many years later, in the days of Nehemiah, God's people humbly and penitently prayed, "You are a God of forgiveness, gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in lovingkindness..." (Neh. 9:17).

David was also a man well-acquainted with the loving nature of God. In Psalm 86:15, he prayed, "But you, O Lord, are a compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness."

Even as the shadow of captivity loomed on the horizon, Jeremiah appealed to a loving God as he prayed for his people. In Jeremiah 32:17-18, we read, "Ah, Sovereign Lord, you have made the heavens and the earth by your great power and outstretched arm. Nothing is too hard for you. You show love to thousands but bring the punishment for the fathers' sins into the laps of their children after them. O great and powerful God, whose name in Lord Almighty, great are your purposes and mighty are your deeds."

What is the point in all these passages? These were people who knew how to appeal to the love and grace of God. How did they know God was loving and gracious? Because God revealed Himself through Moses, His servant.

Sin does not take care of itself. The holiness and justice of God demand that a price be paid. However, the loving, gracious, and compassionate nature of our God is forever demonstrated through the gift of His Son. As a result, like those we have mentioned, we have the blessing of appealing to God on the basis of His love and compassion. God can lift the burden of sin if we will turn to Him in loving faith and obedience.
