GOD IS NOT A MAN

Much of how we live and function as Christians is determined by our view of God and his relationship to us. Improper perspectives of God create either excessive guilt or complacency toward sin. If our moral values do not accurately reflect the portrait of God painted for us in the Bible, then our standards of what is right and wrong are seriously flawed.

Keeping this in mind, there are two mistakes commonly made regarding God and His relationship with man. The first mistake is trying to bring God down to the level of man. In the context of judging the evil deeds of the wicked, God says, "These things you have done, and I kept silence; you thought I was just like you; I will reprove you, and state the case in order before your eyes" (Psa. 50:21). Because God had kept silent, they assumed that meant He approved of their wicked deeds. Some mistake the patience of God for indifference. Solomon expressed it this way: "Because the sentence against an evil deed is not executed quickly, therefore the hearts of the sons of men among them are given fully to do evil" (Eccl. 8:11). Remember that not all accounts are settled immediately. Solomon concluded his book with these words: "The conclusion, when all has been heard, is: Fear God and keep His commandments, because this applies to every person. For God will bring every act to judgment, everything which is hidden, whether it is good or evil" (Eccl. 12:13-14). When we live as though God were not present, we are, in effect, lowering Him to the level of man.

Man's vain attempt to bring God down to the level of man is also seen in an incident involving Balak, the king of Moab. He had sent for a diviner by the name of Balaam to come and curse the Israelites. But, instead of a curse, Balaam pronounced a blessing upon them. He explained what happened, saying, "God is not a man, that He should lie, nor a son of man, that He should repent; has He said, and will He not do it? Or has He spoken, and will He not make it good?" (Num. 23:19). Though a wicked man, Balaam spoke the truth. God's promises cannot be changed by the capricious will of man. God is not a man in the sense that He always keeps His promises. At the dedication of the temple, King Solomon proclaimed: "Blessed be the Lord, who has given rest to His people Israel, according to all that He promised; not one word has failed of all His good promise, which He promised through Moses His servant" (1 Kgs. 8:56). Because it is impossible for God to lie (Heb. 6:18), we can be assured that He will always keep His promises. Doubting His ability to keep His promises is one way we lower God to the level of a man.


