"HOMOSEXUAL" VERSES

Someday, government may require that Bibles be regularly updated to conform with political correctness. Efforts in this direction have already been made and will only increase as we become an increasingly secular society. Christians should resist pressure, legally and socially, to conform our message or manner of life to the world (Rm. 12:1-2).

However, at this point, publishers are more strongly influenced by the relatively conservative leanings of many of our nation's churches. Publishing is a business and these are the customers who will purchase their products. With or without the help of these publishers, God's word will abide forever (Mt. 24:35).

Recently, a man filed a 70 million-dollar law suit against two prominent Bible publishers over "homosexual" verses in the Bible. Although the case doesn't seem to have much traction, a couple of questions came to mind: (1) How long before such a case (directed against the translators rather than the publisher) is taken seriously and, in some way, the government enters into the translation process; and (2) If publishers of the Bible are being sued for "homosexual" verses, such as 1 Corinthians 6:9, doesn't that say something about what the Bible actually says about homosexuality? For years we have been told the Bible does not condemn the practice of homosexuality. Then, why the lawsuit?

This passage condemns a number of sins—fornication, idolatry, adultery, homosexuality, stealing, coveting, drunkenness, reviling, and swindling—saying that those who practice such will not inherit the kingdom of God (1 Cor. 6:9-10). In view of their past, the inspired writer goes on to say, "Such were some of you; but you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God" (vs. 11). The past tense form of the verbs in this text indicates a change of lifestyle along with a change of relationship with the Lord. Surely, no one would seriously contend that a thief, once cleansed, can continue the practice of thievery! The same is true of each of the other sins listed in this passage, including homosexuality. God loves the sinner, including the homosexual. Jesus died for all sinners, including the homosexual. As for us, we must neither ignore nor lash out against God's word but, "in humility receive the word implanted, which is able to save [our] souls" (Jas. 1:21).
