## WHOM GOD HAS CHOSEN

A quick glance at the men Jesus chose to be His apostles reveals that He did not place a premium on social or educational qualifications. This begs the question: "If Christ would have come in the $21^{\text {st }}$ century rather than $1^{\text {st }}$ century, whom would He have selected?" If we were privy to that information, the answer might surprise us.

Hudson Taylor wrote, "God uses men who are weak and feeble enough to lean on Him." Only a man who recognizes his weakness will depend on God for strength. The Scripture says, "God is opposed to the proud, but gives grace to the humble" (Jas. 4:6). Many of the religious leaders of Christ's day were so filled with pride and prejudice that Christ could not find in them a pliable heart. Of those whom Christ did choose, some were fishermen, one a tax-collector, and another an insurrectionist. Yet, for the most part, they all possessed humility, loyalty, and a willingness to learn. They were far from perfect, but after the space of three years with the Master, they became changed men. Concerning Peter and John, Scripture says that, although they were uneducated and untrained men, Christ made such an impact on them that their enemies began to recognize that they had been with Jesus (Acts 4:13)

It is difficult for some to understand how a sense of our own weakness can produce beneficial results. The apostle Paul suffered from a physical ailment which he called his "thorn in the flesh." He prayed three times for relief. But, God's answer was strength to endure rather than relief from infirmity. He said, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness" (2 Cor. 12:9). In the next verse, he concludes, saying, "when I am weak, then I am strong." Indeed, our weakness can magnify God's power when we rely on Him for strength.

If there is one lesson which God has illustrated repeatedly in His word, it is that success results from trusting in God rather than human strength. The army raised by Gideon to fight the Midianites numbered 22 thousand. Though vastly outnumbered, God told Gideon, "The people who are with you are too many for Me to give Midian into their hands, lest Israel become boastful, saying, 'My own power has delivered me.'" (Judg. 7:2). In a series of tests, the number was reduced to a mere 300 so that all would know that it was the Lord who had delivered Israel from the enemies.

God's power is shown in our weakness. God chooses the humble. Paul reminds us that He has not called "many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to shame the things which are strong" (1 Cor. 1:26-27) Because of this important principle, we should heed the advice of Solomon who wrote, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding" (Prov. 3:5).
