AGAINST THE WIND

Hamilton Wright Mabie is credited with having said, "Don't worry about opposition. Remember a kite rises against the wind, not with the wind." If we were somehow given the power to remove all opposition and difficulty from our lives, would that, necessarily, be a good thing for our spiritual well-being? Our natural tendency is to travel the path of least resistance. Following the path of least resistance makes a river crooked and has a similar effect on the development of character.

Jesus never promised freedom from pain or persecution. Quite to the contrary, He said, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me" (Lk. 9:23). The cross Jesus bore was not padded. Neither was it one that could be worn on a chain around the neck. It was a cross of wood—a cross of suffering—a cross of shame. And, when we take up the cross, we take up <u>His</u> cross. There will be opposition; make no mistake about it. Paul stated that "all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will be persecuted" (2 Tim. 3:12). But, the early Christians looked at suffering for the sake of the gospel in a different light than many do today. After the apostle had been threatened and beaten for the sake of their message, "they went on their way... rejoicing that they had been considered worthy to suffer shame for His name" (Acts 5:41).

Enduring opposition has its reward. Paul wrote that this "light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory far beyond all comparison" (2 Cor. 4:17). Jesus said, "Blessed are those who have been persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when men cast insults at you, and persecute you, and say all kinds of evil against you falsely, on account of Me. Rejoice, and be glad, for your reward in heaven is great, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you" (Mt. 5:10-12). Rejoice, because persecution for the sake of righteousness places you in the company of those who have gone on to their eternal reward.

Another benefit of opposition is endurance. James wrote, "Count it all joy, my brethren, when you encounter various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance. And let endurance have its perfect result, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing" (Jas. 1:2-4). A distance runner who trains only downhill with the wind, will lack endurance in a race that is sure to take him uphill against the wind. When difficulties come your way, look to God for help and remember that it is not so much the size of the obstacle, but the direction of our trust that determines victory or defeat.
