### LONGING AFTER GOD'S WAY

Jesus promised satisfaction to those who "hunger and thirst after righteousness" (Mt. 5:6). There is something telling about this promise. Very little is accomplished without desire. Great things are often the result of great desire. Those to whom Jesus promised satisfaction are those who really want to be good, to follow "after righteousness." The psalmist writes, "As the deer pants for the water brooks, so my soul pants for You, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God…" (Ps. 42:1-2). In the first verse of the 63<sup>rd</sup> Psalm, David says, "O God, You are my God; I shall seek You earnestly; my soul thirsts for You, my flesh yearns for You, in a dry and weary land where there is no water." Such thoughts as these may show, in part, why David was called a man after God's heart (Acts 13:22; 1 Sam. 13:14).

Righteousness has been defined as "Whatever has been appointed by God to be acknowledged and obeyed by man" (W. E. Vine). What has been appointed by God is revealed in His word. In God's word, the way of righteousness is revealed. Therefore, our hunger and thirst after righteousness must be matched by our desire to know and follow His teachings.

Jesus promises that the one who hungers and thirsts after righteousness will be satisfied. In contrast, ours is a world filled with discontent. Many look for satisfaction in all the wrong things—alcohol, drugs, illicit sex—but true satisfaction is promised to those who seek after the righteousness of God. The satisfaction of the world is for a moment and then it is gone. By its nature, sins carries diminishing returns so far as pleasure is concerned. Seeking satisfaction in sin requires ever increasing levels of participation to the point where its pursuer becomes hopelessly enslaved.

On the other hand, the pursuit of righteousness produces lasting peace and satisfaction. God is not stingy about giving His blessing. If hunger and thirst led you to knock at a friend's door, they might give you something to eat and drink. How much more will God supply your needs! Total and lasting satisfaction are promised for all who hunger and thirst for righteousness.

The story is told of a young man who went to a wise old man for advice on how to live his life. The old man took him to the river. They got into the river and the old man dunked the young man under the water and held him for a good, long time. After a few moments, the young man began struggling, thinking he might just drown. He finally broke free, grasping for air. Then, the old man explained, "When you long for righteousness as much as you longed for breath—you will attain it."

Jesus promises satisfaction for such seekers. He says, "I am the bread of life; he who comes to me shall not hunger, and he who believes in men shall never thirst" (Jn. 6:35). Turn to Jesus for satisfaction. Turn to His word in your pursuit of righteousness. *--Glen Elliott--*


