THE LIGHTS OF HOME

The story is told of a terrible storm on one of the Great Lakes. A tug boat towing a heavy barge was caught in its fury. Again and again, fierce breakers covered the vessel from bow to stern. All through the night the battle raged. As the boat began taking on water, the crew became more and more disheartened. Somehow, they made it through the night and were rescued the next day. In recounting the events of the previous night, the captain said there was one thing that strengthened them to carry on—one thing that kept hope alive in their hearts—and that was that, shining through the gloom, they could occasionally see the lights of home.

When the apostles faced the news of Christ's impending death, they struggled with deep sorrow. Jesus provided hope, saying, "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also" (John 14:1–3).

Later, when certain Hebrew Christians were being tempted to forsake their devotion to Christ, they were admonished to look "to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2).

Likewise, the apostle Paul encouraged Christians at Colossae, saying, "If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth" (Colossians 3:1–2).

There is little doubt but that times of difficulty will come into the life of every child of God who seeks to follow Jesus. Struggling with the storms of life should not be a source of overwhelming discouragement. Instead, we must hold on and look by faith to the hope set before us. For, even in the darkest night, the eye of faith can catch a glimpse of distant lights shining from our eternal home.
