MAKING PEACE AS CHILDREN OF GOD

If nothing else, the world-wide threat of terror has emphasized our need for peace. Our temporal peace is constantly being threatened by those with murderous and misguided intentions. However, the threat to peace is not just out there somewhere in the Middle East, it is right here in our midst—wherever sin has taken its foothold. In a frustrated sigh, we ask, "How can one person make a difference?" Apparently, Jesus thought God's children can make a difference. In a series of life-changing principles known as the Beatitudes, He said, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God" (Mt. 5:9).

In issuing this promise, Jesus endorsed peacemaking as an honorable pursuit for His followers. While peace is important to us, our concept of peace is often quite shallow. Peace is more than the absence of conflict. It is more than the cessation of hostilities. Even when there are no physical signs of hostility, there may still exist strong underlying currents of resentment and animosity. Many of our efforts at peacemaking fail because we do not get beyond the symptoms to the heart of the matter. Wars and conflicts begin in the heart. Getting to the heart requires an awareness of the fact that there are three dimensions of peace: peace with God, peace with self, and peace with others. These three are interconnected—each one building on the previous. In our pursuit of peace with God, the other two dimensions of peace soon follow.

Jesus promised peace to His disciples. He said, "Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you; not as the world gives, do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, nor let it be fearful" (Jn. 14:27). The peace which the Lord provides is a peace the world cannot provide. It is a peace that "surpasses all comprehension"—a peace that guards the heart and the mind (Ph. 4:6). Where is such peace found? It is found in Christ. In Christ, we are reconciled to God and one another. In Christ we are children of God (Gal. 3:16-17).

So, what is a peacemaker and why are they called children of God? A peacemaker is one who promotes peace in the lives of others. The great work of a peacemaker comes in helping others find peace with God through His Son, Jesus Christ. In times of strife and discord, those who are at peace with God must point others in the direction of God and His word. Peace at the expense of truth is not peace. It is compromise. While compromise is needed in matters of opinion and personal rights; it is condemned in *(continued inside)*
