THE CHURCH IS THE KINGDOM (2)

The church is the kingdom—the kingdom of God, the kingdom of heaven, and the kingdom of Christ. All three expressions are used in Scripture to refer to the church. There are three elements required for a kingdom to exist.

In the first place, a kingdom must have a king. Without a king there can be no kingdom. Israel was a kingdom, even before the anointing of Saul. Original intent for the kingdom of Israel was for God to be its king (1 Sam. 8:7 cf. Jud. 8:23). In asking for a king, the people of Israel did not reject Samuel, but God as their king (1 Sam. 8:5). Even without God as king, they were still a kingdom because they were ruled by Saul and his successors. Centuries later, on the first Pentecost following the ascension of Christ, Peter said that Jesus had been "exalted to the right hand of God" and had been made "both Lord and Christ" (Acts 2:33, 36). This is the practical equivalent of being named king. From that time forward, the kingdom of God, the church, is spoken of as being in existence (Col. 1:13; Mt. 16:18-19). It is unreasonable to believe that a kingdom can exist without a king. It is equally unreasonable to say that Jesus became king at His ascension but will not actually rule as king until He comes again.

A kingdom must also have citizens, those who are subject to the king. Confession of Jesus as Lord is acknowledgment of His kingly right to rule in our lives. Paul reminds us that "our citizenship is in heaven" (Ph. 3:20). Heaven is the place from which Christ rules over His kingdom, the church. It is a heavenly kingdom—the kingdom of heaven. We become citizens in His kingdom as a result of having been born again of the water and Spirit. Jesus said, "unless one is born of water and the Spirit he cannot enter into the kingdom of God" (Jn. 3:5).

Finally, a kingdom must also have laws. It is impossible to govern without laws. While we are not under the Law of Moses; we are under law. Paul calls it "the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus" (Rm. 8:2). James refers to it as "the perfect law, the law of liberty" (Jas. 1:25). Those who argue that we are not under law have failed to appreciate the fact that "the law of the Spirit of life" sets us "free from the law of sin and death" (Rm. 8:2). The law of sin and death is the law which says that death is the penalty for sin (cf. Rm. 6:23). In other words, without being under law to Christ, we are doomed to suffer the penalty death—spiritual and eternal separation from God. Christ is king over His kingdom and rules His citizens through His inspired word. Must we be part of His kingdom to be saved? We will discuss this in our next article.
