A young barber was asked if he had anything for gray hair. He replied, "Yes sir, a lot of respect!" The Bible refers to gray hair as "a crown of glory" (Prov. 16:31). Of course, Solomon was speaking in general terms; for we know that the color of one's hair is not so important as the wisdom and experience that often comes with age. The graving of America is becoming more and more evident as baby boomers become senior citizens. We would do well to consider a few principles related to aging.

Age is relative. Compared to Methuselah, we are all spring chickens. For someone still in their teens, a thirtieth birthday seems light-years away. But to someone looking back. 30 may seem quite young. It's all a matter of perspective. We have all heard it said that it is not so much your age as your attitude. Just because a person has lived a long time does not mean they have developed a heart of wisdom. But, generally speaking, there is a great deal we can learn from those with more experience. In many ways, this vast resource of wisdom and knowledge is overlooked because we live in a youth-oriented society.

Fruitfulness continues throughout life. The inspired writer noted the following: "The righteous flourish like a palm tree and grow like a cedar in Lebanon. They are planted in the house of the Lord; they flourish in the courts of our God. They still bear fruit in old age..." (Ps. 92:12-14). A Palm Tree grows to be about 100 to 150 feet in height and is one of the most productive trees, bearing some 300 to 400 pounds of fruit. While beautiful and stately, it is a tree that bears fruit in old age, between 30 and 100 years of age.

Similarly, the Cedar is a symbol of strength. There are some Cedars of Lebanon in California which are estimated to have been around since before the birth of Christ. The psalmist is simply saying that the righteous will live long and fruitful lives. We could cite many examples of those who have contributed their most significant accomplishments while advanced in years. Paul says, "So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day" (2 Cor. 4:16).

While we need to come to grips with the inevitability of aging and passing from this life, we need not grow discouraged because the real self, the inner person of the heart, lives forever. By faith we live such a life that advances in hope with each passing year.
