ACTIVE COMPASSION

The traits encouraged by Jesus in His Beatitudes are characteristics diametrically opposed to the common thinking and practice of the world. People were shocked to hear what Jesus had to say about what makes life meaningful and rich. Things haven't changed much over the centuries. People are still amazed when they see these principles practiced today. Jesus marked mercy as an essential prerequisite to true happiness when He said, "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy" (Mt. 5:7).

Mercy is "compassionate treatment of an offender" (Amer. Her. Dict. of the Eng. Lang.) The word so translated in Matthew chapter five meant "to feel sympathy with the misery of another, and especially sympathy manifested in act" (W.E. Vine). More than mere sympathy—mercy involves action.

Jesus illustrated what it means to be a good neighbor in the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Lk. 10). A certain Jew fell among robbers who beat him, robbed him, and left him for dead. Some religious people of the day saw the man but did not render aid, choosing instead to pass by on the other side. But a Samaritan, who was on a journey, stopped and provided long-term assistance. The Bible explains that he was moved with compassion. Those who passed by without helping may have felt sorrow for the unfortunate man; but their sympathy did not move them to action. Those who should have been most likely to help did nothing. The man many thought would have been least likely to help demonstrated genuine mercy.

Jesus encountered ten lepers who stood some distance away crying out, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" (Lk. 17:13). What did they want from the Lord? They wanted mercy. They needed more than sympathy. They wanted mercy demonstrated in healing.

Jesus told the story of two men praying at the temple (Lk. 18:9-14). One was a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee's prayer was full of self-praise. His prayer was not heard. But, the prayer of the tax collector was simple and sincere. He cried, "God be merciful to me the sinner!" What did the tax collector ask from God?
