THE SPIRIT OF NON-RETALIATION

In a series of statements designed to heighten a sense of contrast between what they had heard and what He was teaching, Jesus cites various statements from the Law of Moses only to follow up with His own amplification or clarification regarding such principles. Having already discussed the Law's prohibitions against murder, adultery, and false oaths; Jesus continues His remarks, saying, "You have heard that it was said, 'AN EYE FOR AN EYE, AND A TOOTH FOR A TOOTH.' But I say to you, do not resist an evil person; but whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also. If anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, let him have your coat also. Whoever forces you to go one mile, go with him two. Give to him who asks of you, and do not turn away from him who wants to borrow from you" (Mt. 5:38-42). The overall tone of this section is descriptive of what has been called "the spirit of non-retaliation."

"An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth" is one of those phrases with which even the biblically illiterate are all too familiar. It is a statement found three times in the Old Testament. Once as a penalty for causing a miscarriage (Ex. 21:24). Another time in reference to injuring a neighbor (Lev. 24:20). And, finally, as consequence to bearing false testimony in a court of law (Dt. 19:21). In all three instances, the penalty was to be carried out after judicial process.

As a 21st century rule of life, the "eye for an eye and tooth for a tooth" philosophy overlooks several important details. First, it is part of the Law of Moses—a law that is no longer in force—it has been nailed to the cross (Col. 2:14). Getting even with our enemies under the guise of following God's word is nothing more than a perversion of truth. Even if exchanging laws were possible, it would not be a good trade. We cannot pick and choose from the Old Testament those things which we would carry over into the New Testament. If we could, we would be bound to keep it all (Jas. 2:10). But the plain testimony of Scripture is that to do so would cause us to be "severed from Christ" and "fallen from grace" (Gal. 5:4).

A second problem associated with living by an "eye for an eye and tooth for a tooth" code of conduct is that such overlooks the purpose behind the law in the first place. The law was in place for the purpose of providing an equitable system of judicial (continued inside)

justice. It was designed to prevent the escalation of violence, hatred, and vigilante justice. These are the very things that lie at the heart of many of our wars and conflicts.

On a personal level, Jesus went on to cite examples of how this principle of non-retaliation works-examples that relate to such things as turning the other cheek and going the second mile. Lord willing, we will talk about these in our next article.
