FEARS AND DOUBTS

D. L. Moody made this astute observation: "Some say if only my fears and doubts will leave then I will get to work". But instead you should get to work and then your fears and doubts will leave." Fear and doubt have a paralyzing effect. So long as we live under their shadow, we will find it difficult to accomplish anything worthwhile. "Act better than you feel" and "Act yourself into a better way of feeling" are statements reflective of this truth. If we wait for the feeling to come, we may never accomplish what needs to be done. Ninety percent of the work that is done in this world is done by those who did not feel like doing it. From a positive perspective, we might say, "When we do the right thing, good feelings come our way."

Jesus came to provide us with the "full and abundant life" (Jn. 10:10). He understands our feelings. Hebrews 4:15 says that "we do not have a high priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has been tempted in all things as we are, yet without sin." Jesus understands that we do not always feel like doing the right thing. In fact, there are times when we are strongly tempted to do the very thing we know is wrong! But, Jesus also knows that, unless the conscience has been hardened by sin, we are created in such a way that right actions produce good feelings and wrong actions produce bad feelings.

Too often, the Lord is relegated to second place behind the way that we feel. But, if Jesus is Lord of all, shouldn't He be Lord also of the way that we feel? We may not be able to control the circumstances around us, but we can control how we react to those circumstances. The Bible teaches that what we think determines a lot about what we become. So, let's resolve to be those who rise above feelings of doubt and fear so as to truly make Jesus Lord of all. Keep in mind the words of the apostle Paul, "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me" (Ph. 4:13).
