REBUILDING NATIONAL CHARACTER

Directing our thoughts toward God and His inspired word is a worthwhile endeavor for all of us, especially for those who govern in our nation's capital. J.W. Alexander said, "The study of God's word, for the purpose of discovering God's will, is the secret discipline which has formed the greatest characters." Considering how much effort is being spent to keep the Bible out of our schools and governmental institutions, it is surprising to learn that those who framed our constitution had every intent on forming a nation guided by the principles of the Bible.

Thomas Jefferson said, "I have always said, and will always say, the studious perusal of the sacred volume will make better homes, better citizens, better fathers, and better husbands." John Quincy Adams said, "The first and almost the only book deserving of universal distinction is the Bible. I speak as a man of the world to the men of the world and I say to you, 'Search the Scriptures.'" Daniel Webster wrote, "If we abide by the principles taught in the Bible our country will go on prospering, but if we and our posterity neglect its instruction and authority, no man can tell how sudden a catastrophe may overwhelm us and bury us and our glory in profound obscurity." Did these men know of what they spoke? How many of our present legislators would be willing to sincerely make such statements?

The Bible reveals the profound and timeless truth that "Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a disgrace to any people" (Prov. 14:34). With this statement, many profess agreement. But how do they define "righteousness?" The Bible defines righteousness as follows: "all [God's] commandments are righteousness" (Ps. 119:172). In a world where morality is dictated by popular opinion, many hide behind a façade of religious devotion while denying the Creator's right to define standards of right and wrong. This is not righteousness. It is self-righteousness. In describing our national character, it is a trait which will inevitably lead to ruin.

God's word is the standard by which conduct is measured. Jesus said, "He who rejects Me and does not receive My sayings, has one who judges him; the word I spoke is what will judge him at the last day" (Jn. 12:48). God's word is the objective standard governing moral behavior. It is not to be tampered with by modern man. Those who claim the right to reject or modify God's commands to their own liking presume upon the authority of God and cast their vote in the direction of anarchy. If I can reject one of God's moral principles, why cannot I do the same for others? And, if I have the right to live solely on the basis of what I like or dislike; then, who am I to say that others cannot do the same? In such a world as this, the Bible has no recognized authority and we are left defenseless to stem the tide of moral ambiguity and lawlessness. Such infection is contagious. The unfolding of lawless behavior and immoral conduct will continue spreading so long as we turn our backs on the values of the Bible. We cannot legitimately claim to be "One Nation Under God" unless we place ourselves "under" His divine authority.
