MAKE YOUR VOTE COUNT!

In respect to human prognostication, hindsight is generally far more accurate than foresight—post-analysis than pre-analysis. However, so far as heaven is concerned, the God we serve knows "the end from the beginning, and from ancient times things which have not been done…" (Is. 46:10).

We are at a loss when it comes to accurately predicting the success or failure of a new president-elect. Much of that is measured by our own particular standards of what constitutes success in a president. But, the fact remains that we are finite human beings limited to speculations and guesses about the future. It is far more productive to trust in the One who holds the future in His hands; pray for those in high places (1 Tim. 2:1-2); and obey civil authorities as those which have been established by God (Rm. 13:1-2).

Keeping this in mind, please allow the following post-election comparison to the spiritual realm. While the right to vote is central to the democratic process in our republic, there are many who simply do not exercise that right of citizenship. Postanalysis sometimes reveals what might have been a different result had some chosen to exercise their right to vote. But, that is part of our system of government, we have the right to vote as well as the right to abstain from voting.

An interesting summary of Jesus' mission is found in the opening chapter of the Gospel of John. The inspired text says, "He came to His own, and those who were His own did not receive Him. But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God" (Jn. 1:11–13).

From this passage, we might observe the following: (1) Not every believer is a child of God (Jn. 12:42 cf. Jas. 2:19); but every believer has the right to become His child. (2) Some will exercise their right to become children of God through spiritual rebirth (Jn. 3:3-5); but other believers will not exercise that right. And, (3) by means of post-analysis, the results would have been quite different for some had they simply chosen to exercise their right (Mt. 7:21; Rev. 22:14).

"Drop The Rock"

Scripture: (John 8:7–9, ESV)

"Teacher, this woman has been caught in the act of adultery. Now in the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say" (John 8:4–5)?

The angry mob, foaming at the mouth for "justice," hovered over Jesus as He knelt before them in silence. They demanded a verdict. They hated how Jesus treated sinners, so they cornered Him with a blatant case—a woman caught in the very act of adultery. Jesus refused to be trapped. As always, He reframed the guestion entirely.

The Lord rose to His feet and said, "Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her." He spoke one sentence, and then He knelt back down again. As His words registered, "they went away one by one, beginning with the older ones". What a striking observation: they left in order of age. In a large group of people, all intent on stoning this woman, the older ones dropped their rocks and walked away first, and the Holy Spirit inspired the Apostle John to write that exact detail.

Can you relate to that? I can! Life experience teaches us to drop the rock. When we're young, we tend to be more teachable, more humble, more flexible, but we can also be more arrogant, more confident, more exacting of the truth, less inclined to drop the rock. Over time, we start to learn some hard life lessons and experience disappointment and disillusion.

Over time, we grow tired of ourselves. If only we could trade in our personalities and work on a different set of problems for a while. When we have fallen more, when we have failed more, as consequences pile up on us, we become less inclined to drive home others failures. We know what it feels like to fail.

Check yourself on self-righteousness. If you actually believe that you are better than someone else, then you are taking credit for what the grace of God has produced in you. Is that you?
