GREAT IS THY FAITHFULNESS!

Victory is founded upon the faithfulness of God rather than the groundless security of human achievement. Our inheritance in heaven is not the result of our many good deeds, but the result of having accepted God's grace in faithful obedience. Since faithfulness involves fidelity, loyalty, and devotion to Christ, it will always find expression in good works.

Faithfulness has its benefits in this life as well as in the life to come. Faithfulness provides security. The Psalmist notes that "The Lord preserves the faithful..." (Ps. 31:23). Solomon reminds his son that "A faithful man will abound with blessings..." (Prov. 28:20). Increased usefulness in the Master's service is another blessing of faithfulness. In the Parable of the Talents, Jesus told the five-talent man: "you were faithful with a few things, I will put you in charge of many things..." (Mt. 25:23). Many are the blessings of faithfulness in Christian living. Perhaps, these were best summed up when Jesus said, "I came that they might have life, and might have it abundantly" (Jn. 10:10).

In a world of dishonesty and treachery, there is a crying need for faithfulness. However, faithfulness must be nurtured. David writes, "Trust in the Lord, and do good; dwell in the land and <u>cultivate faithfulness</u>" (Ps. 37:3). The Psalmist later describes the ancient Israelites as a "stubborn and rebellious generation, a generation that did not prepare its heart, and whose <u>spirit was not faithful to God</u>" (Ps. 78:8). Faithfulness is not an accident, it is the result of careful preparation. As Wendell Winkler notes, faithfulness "is a mind-set, not a Sunday habit."

One of the most helpful things we can do in cultivating faithfulness is to consider the faithfulness of God. Jeremiah exclaims, "Great is Thy faithfulness!" (Lam. 3:23). These words echoed the sentiments of David, who prays, "Your faithfulness reaches to the skies" (Ps. 36:5). In difficult times, there is great comfort in the knowledge that "God is faithful" (1 Cor. 10:13). Peter likewise encourages suffering Christians to "entrust their souls to a faithful Creator in doing what is right" (1 Pet. 4:19). And, when we do fall into sin, John reminds us of God's promise that "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 Jn. 1:9).

How can we be disloyal to the One who has been so faithful to us? We can see His faithfulness everywhere about us. The orderliness of the created world speaks volumes about the faithfulness of God. The sun rises every morning and sets every evening. Indeed, God's faithfulness reaches to the heavens! Where would we turn if we could not count on the (continued on the inside)
