"DID YOU HAVE FUN?"

Frequently asked of children by well-intentioned parents is the above question. It is a question underscoring the fact that, too many times, the rightness or wrongness of a particular activity is measured by the pleasure derived from the activity. Simply defined, fun is "a source of enjoyment or pleasure; an amusing diversion." We are grateful to have been created with the capacity to experience pleasure. But pleasure, itself, was never intended to be our goal in life nor the standard by which we measure morality.

Because we live in a pleasure-driven society, we must take special care not to be taken captive by worldly pleasure. Such cannot deliver what is promised. Peter warns of those who promise "freedom while they themselves are slaves of corruption; for by what a man is overcome, by this he is enslaved" (2 Pet. 2:19). Sinful pleasure is a trap. Things that feel good now may later bring pain and sorrow. Many are the examples which might be cited—alcoholism, drug addiction, and sexual immorality. The story is the same: for a moment of reckless folly, there is a lifetime of regret—a high price to pay for "just having a little fun."

There is a better way. Jesus promised a full and abundant life (Jn. 10:10). He died and rose again that we might rejoice forevermore (Jn. 16:22). We must be God-seekers, not pleasure-seekers. Jesus is the only way to the Father (Jn. 14:6). In the Father there is "every good and perfect gift" (Jas. 1:17). Pleasure derived from the legitimate use of God's precious gifts brings joy and gratitude. Bowing to the god of pleasure is as inappropriate as bowing to an idol.

Learning to tell the difference between legitimate pleasure and sinful pleasure requires spiritual growth—the development of discernment through proper education of the conscience with the word of God. God's word is our moral standard. Feelings are not a safe guide (Jer. 10:23). When we follow the Creator's plan, as revealed in His word, life provides its richest joy and most sublime pleasures. Life's greatest joys result from denying sinful pleasures and setting ourselves free to become servants of righteousness (Tit. 2:12; Rm. 6:17-18). Rather than inhibiting joyful living, God's commandments provide the guidance we need to enjoy happiness in this life and in the world to come.
