BUILDING RESOLVE

Regarded by many as one of our greatest philosophical theologians, Jonathan Edwards is most famous for his sermon, "Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God." No doubt this sermon was quite impactful in the days of his preaching, twenty or thirty years prior to the American Revolution. Perhaps, you have seen pictures inspired by that lesson. One that comes to mind depicts the hand of God holding a sinner suspended by a thread over the fires of hell. Concerning this man, it is interesting to note that he had written out for himself 70 personal resolutions which provided foundation for his life.

Some proudly boast that they do not make resolutions. So forceful and intimidating are their voices that others are negatively influenced to follow the same course in their lives. One might as well erase repentance and spiritual growth from our vocabulary as to discard the necessity of making personal resolutions. Resolutions do not have to be made on the first day of a new year. Nor is it necessarily helpful to make as many as 70 new resolutions at the same time. But most of us would be strengthened in our walk with God if we would focus more completely on the fundamental priorities of life.

Satan is in the business of distraction. "Majoring in Minors" is required learning in his course of instruction. The scribes and Pharisees were prize students who carefully kept detailed instructions out of the Law while neglecting weightier matters such as justice, mercy, and faithfulness (Mt. 23:23). Jesus identified the greatest commands in the Law as loving God with all our hearts and loving our neighbor as ourselves (Mt. 22:37-39). Only when these principles are firmly established in our minds, are we prepared to build strong resolutions in our service to God.

When encountering the everyday struggles of making a living, we are often distracted from making a life worth living. Jesus said that life does not consist of our possessions (Lk. 12:15). The fundamental priority of life is expressed by Jesus' command to "seek first His kingdom and His righteousness" (Mt. 6:33). Too many have allowed the world to shape their view of success. Solomon spent some time in Satan's course of study. However, after exploring all that the world had to offer, he concluded that the whole purpose of life is to "fear God and keep His commandments" (Eccl. 12:13). Our lives must be built around loving respect and obedience for God. Otherwise, our lives will be full of distractions but empty so far as purpose is concerned.




