## **A SENSE OF PRIDE**

We're not talking about the ostentatious, arrogant, inflated pride that is so often seen in the world. The Bible clearly warns that such pride "goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before stumbling" (Prov. 16:18). Such pride is foolish in that "God is opposed to the proud, but gives grace to the humble" (Jas. 4:6).

The kind of pride we are referring to is that which takes proper satisfaction in our spiritual identity and origin. Isaiah called his people back to God, saying, "Look to the rock from which you were hewn..." (Is. 51:1). In other words, "Remember that you came from Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob." Likewise, we need to remember that we are God's children and take pride in the fact that we belong to Him (1 Jn. 3:1; 1 Cor. 3:23). "The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God..." (Rom. 8:16). If one has been baptized for the forgiveness of sin, he has received the gift of the Holy Spirit and his name is written in the Lamb's book of life (Rev. 21:27). We are more precious than all the gold in the world. So, take pride in the fact that you belong to Jesus.

If you worked in an automobile factory, would you take greater pride in your work if you were working on an expensive sports car or a budget economy vehicle? We belong to God and are worth more than all the Cadillacs that have ever been produced. We ought to be very proud of who we are. While we may be proud to be Americans; in a much greater sense, we ought to be proud to be Christians.

In the future, people are going to know much more about us than ever before. Privacy, for the most part, may someday become a thing of the past. No doubt, the technology is available so that, in the near future, one might pass his hand through some kind of device and, almost immediately, all the pertinent information about his life will be shown on a screen—name, address, credit rating, state of health, financial status, criminal record—the whole life, at least much of what characterizes it. Something to consider: if you are one day to live in that kind of world—if everybody's going to know who you are, then you need to make sure that you are the kind of person in whom you can be proud. Are you a Christian? If so, then take pride in following Jesus.
