PRESSING ON IN OUR PURSUIT

Oliver Cromwell said, "He who stops being better stops being good." A life worth living is an uphill struggle. No one who wishes to leave this world a better place is content simply to coast through life. We must strive for what is better.

The apostle Paul lived a life marked by great accomplishment; yet, he was always looking to become a better person. The Christian's definition of *better* is *Christ*. Paul could have boasted in the persecutions which he had endured for the sake of the gospel. He could have gloried in the number of souls he had won for the Lord or the number of churches he had planted. But he didn't. The same motivation which produced such relentless effort and determination in preaching the gospel also kept him from self-glorification. His life was marked by reaching forward and striving to be more like the Master who bought him. In the book of Philippians, we hear him say, "Not that I have already become perfect, but I press on in order that I may lay hold of that for which also I was laid hold of by Christ Jesus. Brethren, I do not regard myself as having laid hold of it yet; but one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and reaching forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus" (Ph. 3:12-14).

For the Christian, there is but one ultimate purpose, motivation, and goal for life and eternity. That driving passion may be summed up in a single word, *Jesus*. Our efforts in life should be geared toward becoming as close to and as much like Jesus as possible. And, when such is our intent, the hope of heaven and a home with Jesus becomes a mighty force deterring evil and promoting good in our daily lives.

Paul wrote: "If then you have been raised up with Christ, keep seeking the things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Set your mind on the things above, not on the things that are on the earth. For you have died and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, who is our life, is revealed, then you also will be revealed with Him in glory" (Col. 3:1-4).

Make Christ the hope and purpose of your life. It will be an uphill struggle, but striving to be like Jesus will make it all worthwhile and you will be made better in the pursuit.


