# **ABC's of the Gospel**

"All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God…" (Romans 3:23).

Good news is best received in the backdrop of bad news. We are sinners in need of the Savior. Denying personal sin is self-deception and makes God out to be a liar (1 Jn. 1:8-10).

In a world where we are hard-pressed to find anything expressly forbidden, we must shine as lights in the midst of darkness (Philippians 2:15). Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to the apostles to "convict the world concerning sin" (John 16:8). Because its wages is death (Romans 6:23), the unregenerated soul is "dead in [its] transgressions and sins" (Ephesians 2:1).

"Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29).

The mission of John the Baptist was to prepare the way for the One who would deliver us from the power and penalty of our sins. John pointed his disciples to Jesus, referring to Him as our sacrificial Lamb. We are not rescued from our sins by any means other than the precious blood of Jesus, "a lamb unblemished and spotless" (1 Pet. 1:19).

In 1876, Robert Lowry wrote the words and music to the still popular hymn entitled, "Nothing But the Blood." The Law of Moses stressed the importance of blood in spiritual cleansing (Hebrews 9:22). However, the bloody offerings of the Law were "only a shadow of good things to come" (Hebrews 10:1). It was "impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins" (vs. 4). Only the blood of Jesus can take away our sins.

"Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).

The amazing grace of God is seen in Christ's invitation to come to Him for rest from the bur den of our sins. As the good shepherd, Jesus lays down His life for the sheep (John 10:11). The beauty of divine forgiveness is described by the prophet in these words: "Though your sins are as scarlet, they will be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they will be like wool" (Isaiah 1:18).

In this Great Invitation, Jesus goes on to say, "Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me..." (Matthew 11:29). Faith in Christ is essentially a learned behavior. Jesus says, "Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father, comes to Me" (John 6:45 cf. Romans 10:17). As we come to Jesus, He becomes the "source of eternal salvation" to "all those who obey Him" (Hebrews 5:9).
