ELDERS ARE SHEPHERDS

"Elder" and "overseer" are interchangeable terms used in God's word to describe the same work in the Lord's church (1 Tim. 3:1 cf. Tit. 3:5). But, does the Bible support the idea of referring to an elder or overseer as a shepherd?

The apostle Paul warned the elders at Ephesus to "Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shep-herd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood" (Acts 20:28). In similar manner, Peter, exhorted his fellow elders to "shepherd the flock of God among you, exercising oversight not under compulsion, but voluntarily, according to the will of God..." (1 Peter 5:2). That there is a close relationship between "overseer" and "shepherd" is indicated by the fact that the overseer is appointed to shepherd the flock and those who are shepherding the flock are exhorted to exercise oversight. In both passages, "shepherd" (poimaino) is a verb describing the responsibilities of overseers.

The same word, in its noun form (poimen), is used in Ephesians four to describe Christ's gifts to His church. The English Standard Version translates: "And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the <u>shepherds</u> and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ..." (vss. 11-12). While "shepherds" is rendered "pastors" in a number of translations, it is the noun form of the verb "shepherd." What do we call those who shepherd the flock? We call them shepherds. "Pastors" is also an acceptable translation, but carries a different meaning in modern denominational circles.

"Shepherds", as it is translated in the English Standard Version of Ephesians 4:11, is exactly the same word used by our Lord when He referred to Himself as "the good shepherd" (Jn. 10:11). The word is used 18 times in the New Testament to refer to "one who tends flocks or herds, shepherd, a herdsman..." (Mounce's Complete Expository Dictionary of Old and New Testament Words). While Jesus is "the good shepherd", elders are "under-shepherds" serving under "the Chief Shepherd" (1 Pet. 5:4). Elders are overseers. They are also shepherds. The three terms are used interchangeably in Scripture to describe a noble work in the Lord's body (1 Tim. 3:1).
