<u>Studies in Mark</u> Lesson Two: First Things First (Mk. 1:1-45)

Warm-Up: When is flexibility most needed in meeting the challenges of our spiritual priorities? What dangers are posed by too much flexibility?

1. What was the purpose of John's ministry? By what personal characteristics is John known as a result of the way he carried out his work? Which of these is most needed in God's service today? (Mk. 1:1-8).

2. Upon what conditions was John's baptism predicated? (Mk. 1:4-5; Acts 19:4).

3. How are the three persons of the Godhead distinguished from one another in the baptism of Jesus? (Mk. 1:9-11).

4. How long did Jesus battle temptation? (Mk. 1:12-13; Lk. 4:13). How can we better prepare for our next round of temptation? (1 Pet. 5:8-10; Eph. 6:10-11).

5. What role did angels serve in the ministry of Jesus? (Mk. 1:13; Lk. 22:43 cf. Hb. 1:14; 13:2).

6. What indispensable trait of discipleship is seen in the four fishermen as they accepted the call to follow Jesus? (Mk. 1:14-20; 10:28).

7. Why were the multitudes amazed at the teaching of Christ? (Mk. 1:22, 27; Jn. 7:46).

8. For what possible reasons would Jesus have been reluctant for demons to reveal His true identity? (Mk. 1:24-25, 34).

9. How does Mark describe the popularity of Christ during His earthly ministry? (Mk. 1:28, 32-33; 2:2; 3:20; 6:31). What effect did Jesus' popularity have on the daily workings of His ministry? (Mk. 1:35-38, 45).
